## The Book of Mark:

## A Pivotal Parable

Jesus then began to speak to them in parables: "A man planted a vineyard. He put a wall around it, dug a pit for the winepress and built a watchtower. Then he rented the vineyard to some farmers and moved to another place. <sup>2</sup> At harvest time he sent a servant to the tenants to collect from them some of the fruit of the vineyard. <sup>3</sup> But they seized him, beat him and sent him away empty-handed. <sup>4</sup> Then he sent another servant to them; they struck this man on the head and treated him shamefully. <sup>5</sup> He sent still another, and that one they killed. He sent many others; some of them they beat, others they killed.

"He had one left to send, a son, whom he loved. He sent him last of all, saying, 'They will respect my son.'

<sup>7</sup> "But the tenants said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let's kill him, and the inheritance will be ours.' <sup>8</sup> So they took him and killed him, and threw him out of the vineyard.
<sup>9</sup> "What then will the owner of the vineyard do? He will come and kill those tenants and give the vineyard to others. <sup>10</sup> Haven't you read this passage of Scripture:

"'The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; <sup>11</sup> the Lord has done this, and it is marvelous in our eyes'?"

<sup>12</sup> Then the chief priests, the teachers of the law and the elders looked for a way to arrest him because they knew he had spoken the parable against them. But they were afraid of the crowd; so they left him and went away. Mark 12:1-12 (NIV)

Let me sing now for my beloved A song of my beloved about His vineyard. My beloved had a vineyard on a fertile hill. <sup>2</sup> He dug it all around, cleared it of stones, And planted it with the choicest vine. And He built a tower in the middle of it, And also carved out a wine vat in it; Then He expected it to produce good grapes, But it produced only worthless ones. <sup>3</sup> "And now, you inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, Judge between Me and My vineyard. <sup>4</sup> What more was there to do for My vineyard that I have not done in it? Why, when I expected it to produce good grapes did it produce worthless ones? <sup>5</sup> So now let Me tell you what I am going to do to My vineyard: I will remove its hedge and it will be consumed; I will break down its wall and it will become trampled ground. <sup>6</sup> I will lay it waste; It will not be pruned nor hoed, But briars and thorns will come up. I will also command the clouds not to rain on it." Isaiah 5:1-6 (NASB)

> The vineyard of the LORD Almighty is the nation of Israel, and the people of Judah are the vines he delighted in. And he looked for justice, but saw bloodshed; for righteousness, but heard cries of distress. Isaiah 5:7 (NASB)

For these are rebellious people, deceitful children, children unwilling to listen to the LORD's instruction. <sup>10</sup> They say to the seers, "See no more visions!" and to the prophets, "Give us no more visions of what is right! Tell us pleasant things, prophesy illusions. <sup>11</sup> Leave this way, get off this path, and stop confronting us with the Holy One of Israel!" Isaiah 30:9-11 (NIV)

From the time your ancestors left Egypt until now, day after day, again and again I sent you my servants the prophets. <sup>26</sup> But they did not listen to me or pay attention. They were stiffnecked and did more evil than their ancestors.' Jeremiah 7:25-26 (NIV)
